Illinois Supreme Court Policy on Assistance to Court Patrons by Circuit Clerks, Court Staff, Law Librarians, and Court Volunteers

Dear all.

On behalf of the Supreme Court Commission on Access to Justice, I am pleased to share with you the new *Illinois Supreme Court Policy on Assistance to Court Patrons by Court Clerks, Court Staff, Law Librarians, and Court Volunteers.* The policy, which was adopted by the Supreme Court effective April 1, 2015, was developed by the ATJ Commission and its Court Guidance & Training Committee after extensive consultation with judges, court clerks and law librarians around Illinois.

The purpose of the policy is to guide circuit clerks, law librarians and other front-line court personnel with respect to the assistance they can provide to court patrons, especially patrons trying to navigate the court system without the representation of a lawyer.

The ATJ Commission's Court Guidance & Training Committee will work with the AOIC and the Illinois Association of Court Clerks to support understanding of the policy through future training events.
